Ethel Sue Lumb was born in 1916 in Huntsville, MO. She received her bachelor's degree in education from the University of Missouri and her doctorate degree from Washington University in St. Louis. She joined the faculty in the Department of Zoology at Vassar College in Poughkeepsie, NY, in 1953, where she studied developmental and cellular biology including electron microscopy. She received the distinguished professor of biology award from Vassar College and was listed in the American Men and Women of Science. She died on April 26, 1994, in Columbia, MO.

The Curators of the University of Missouri established the Ethel Sue Lumb Award in 2001 for the purpose of providing fellowships for graduate students in the Division of Biological Sciences, "provided that such students are of good moral character and in need of financial aid." Graduate students who have completed their comprehensive exam, are more than one year away from graduation, and completed a FAFSA in the year the award is given are eligible to apply. Selected recipients will receive a one-time \$2,000 award added to their stipend.
